



Happy New Year!! Hope all had a joyous holiday season.

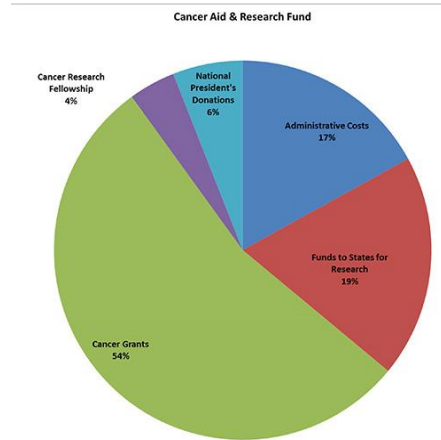
